- 32 I run in the path of your commands, for you have broadened my understanding.
- ³⁵ Direct me in the path of your commands, for there I find delight.
- ¹⁰¹ I have kept my feet from every evil path so that I might obey your word.
- ¹⁰⁴ I gain understanding from your precepts; therefore I hate every wrong path.
- ¹⁰⁵ Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.

A bike path is great. It makes my riding carefree and safe. Make God's Word your life path! In August, our sermons will encourage you on God's safe path – even when arrows are falling around you.

Meet Your Missions: Lutheran Asian Ministries

Lutheran Asian Ministries is the Faith Lutheran Mission Partner we are spotlighting this month. We are pleased to partner with them and here is why. Lutheran Vietnamese Ministries (LVM) began in 2003 out of Lutheran Church of the Cross in Altoona. In 2013 LVM joined the work being done by Pastor Tom LoVan of Morningside Lutheran Church in Sioux City. It was then that

Lutheran Asian Ministries (LAM) was formed.

The work began primarily in Vietnam and Cambodia. In the last few years they have expanded their mission and are currently working in five countries - Cambodia, Thailand, Laos, Vietnam and Myanmar - with the approximate population of 1.5 million people. Three of these countries are in the top 30 countries persecuting Christians. LAM is a recognized ministry partner with Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC).

LAM exists to share the news of Jesus and the love of God with the people of these Southeast Asian countries. They cooperate with the governments of Laos, Vietnam and Myanmar to help in the development of religious, educational and well-water objectives. LAM funds staffing projects in Southeast Asia that partner with others to help people in need.

LAM is based in the countries of Siam Reap, Cambodia, Yangon, Myanmar and the capital city of Vientiane, Laos. They work throughout all of the Southeast Asian nations to help the poor, share the good news of the Gospel and strive to improve their lives.

our advancing years to His glory.





In this family photo, some members are cut off in both the directory family photo (the square photo) and the family photo (the circle photo) in our Simple Church individual records.







The Stewardship Team reflected on wanting to take the time to feature the staff God has blessed us with because we appreciate their leadership and teaming up for the ministry of Faith. We know they don't take the place of our lay people, but they do help us all be better stewards. Here's a reminder over the next few months of the great staff God has blessed us with.

Lori Krei, Church Administrator and Technology Director



There is not a hat throughout the building that Lori has not worn at some point in her volunteer years (from 2010-2014) and paid staff years (2014-present) at Faith Lutheran. In general, she assists members and guests with anything and everything they need; a Jack of all trades! She does the bookkeeping portion of our finances: receiving and processing offering along with receiving and paying the bills. She maintains our computers, all licenses, and domain names. She is our ultimate tech guru of every aspect with worship every Sunday, rehearsals on Wednesdays and any special event. Sounds pretty normal ... but when I asked her for more details, this is what came out. Lori has 50-70 bills every single month to send off checks to, or pay online. As for computers, we have 9 in use at the

moment, and she is preparing 3 more to replace the relics of our computers in use. We have close to 20 licenses and online subscriptions that Lori stays on top of, along with 2 domain names currently in use and other shorter domain names she's reserved for future use. Are you tired just reading about all of that? That's quite the detail our beloved Administrator oversees ... and we're not done yet!

On Sunday mornings, to get all the tech up and ready, Lori unlocks the doors at least 2 hours before worship even begins. She gets equipment warmed up and ready for rehearsal at 8:00 a.m., and once that is over it's time to prepare to stream the service live so we can touch souls for Jesus through the internet! And once worship is over, she doesn't get to turn it all off and go home. She has to download the live video just recorded, Once she heads back to her office to count offering and such, she can hopefully eat dinner by noon ... but that might be pushing it a bit. Ok, that just about sums it up ... for Sunday alone, not to mention the other six days of the week!

That's the detail of her position, but what she really favors about her job is visiting with members and guests, assisting both with any request they have. Ultimately her technology knowledge, and streamlining processes at Faith, is another joy of hers in this position.

When asking her more about her personal interests, she reminded me that she likes to keep to herself and doesn't think she has any hidden talents to share. I classified that as more of the humble servant God has blessed us with in Lori Krei. She is a gem and we really are going to miss having her on staff! She did let me know that she enjoys sewing (not quilting) clothes, tote bags, pillowcases, stuffed animals, games for kids, or anything interesting that catches her eye. She also really enjoys genealogy and really enjoys using technology to make life easier and more organized. Above it all, spending time with her grandsons is her all-time favorite and the icing on the cake!

But the heart of it all is where she's seen God at work during her time at Faith Lutheran. She reflected on how the worship services televised on SMU and YouTube are the greatest places she's seen God at work, and even more so now with live-streaming, our church reaches people in real time. Lori said, "The world needs Jesus, and this is one way to share His word and love." She also reflected on other God-moments at Faith saying, "God is most definitely working through LifeKids. If only people had the opportunity to daily see how these children learn about life and are blessed by the LifeKids program!"

Lori, saying thank you is not enough for all you have done and all you do for us. The 4 years of volunteer work and 8 years on paid staff have been wonderful years you've shared with Faith Lutheran, and we couldn't have been blessed with anyone as talented, passionate, and skilled as you are for our Administrator position. Well done, good and faithful servant, for all the help you've been

Radina Jansen: Director of LifeKids

LifeKids began as our mid-week children's ministry on Wednesday evenings, but God turned it into something bigger than we expected; He turned it into a Monday-Friday after school program. LifeKids is beginning its 3rd year this fall, and Radina Jansen has been the director of the after-school program since it's blossoming in 2020.

Radina is one gifted and passionate woman when it comes to children. Before coming to Faith, she taught special education to K-6th graders for 20 years and was in the classroom for 3 years with 1st graders in the Fort Dodge area. After leaving the classroom, Radina worked for Prairie Lakes AEA as a special



education consultant working with teachers, both general and special education teachers, along with children and parents covering all ages preschool through 12th grade. Again, a very passionate woman for the education of children, and even more so now when she can teach her faith and God's love for us to the kids every day.

When LifeKids came up, she was all about it. Radina decided to apply for the director job when she heard God's voice telling her to take a leave from the AEA. She's had many new challenges from learning Department of Human Services procedures, to 501c3 development, developing a parent and staff handbook, and taking classes to be a director. For Radina, it's all about God! When you ask her what she does, it's not about directing, it's about the opportunity she has to teach children about God's love for them and the Bible every day. If you haven't had a chance to get to know Radina, she's the one with the love of Christ exuding from her ... and the kids are pretty drawn to that as well. In Radina's switch to directing LifeKids, her calling to make a difference, she gets to plan, prepare, and present every aspect of the program instead of the limited time she got to work with children through the AEA.

In her own personal time, she loves to read, scrap book, travel and spend plenty of time with her grandchildren. You might not know that she also enjoys growing houseplants and flowers outside in her flower gardens, especially petunias because it reminds her of her grandmother who is her role model. Her grandmother taught Sunday School to 4-year-olds for 40 years, which sounds to me like Radina is following in her grandmother's legacy; what a gift! But what's something deeper Radina wants you to know? When asked, she's always pointing back to her faith. Radina said, "God has never left my side during the ups and downs in my life. I love children, enjoy their excitement in ordinary things, and want all children to know that they can overcome yucky stuff." God's got Radina in just the right place for His plan! More than that, she's also a vocalist for us on Sundays, on the Music and Creative Arts Team as well as preparing and leading Children's Messages. She's also filled in the daily custodian role when there wasn't one for LifeKids this past winter and spring.

Radina continued talking about the kiddos, that God has blessed us with, at LifeKids when I asked about where God is working. She stated, "I see him working in the lives of the children that attend LifeKids. They have such great insight, ask thought provoking questions and try to use what they've learned about the Bible at school and home. Each year they have become more compassionate towards others and not so consumed by their wants. They get excited about helping others through the service projects."

All the updates you prepare for us monthly, Radina, really showcase exactly what you're talking about. Compassion and more focused on what others want before themselves is definitely God at work in these young lives...and I would go further to say God at work in their families as well. Well done, good and faithful servant, Radina! Thank you for saying "yes" to directing such an important ministry God has given us at Faith so we can reach out to the community for the younger ages all to share the light and love of Christ. Stewardship of Your Whole Life by Rev. Robert Blezard

Before you read further, stop and list the top five things you value most in life? Then rank them by importance. Go!

All done? If you're like most people, your top-five list includes family, health, time, God, friends, job, home or community. Does money even show up? For many of us, it doesn't, and yet most of church talk about "stewardship" involves how we use our gifts of money.

Yes, we are "stewards," or caretakers of the material wealth with which God has blessed us, but we are also responsible for nourishing and cherishing all the OTHER blessings that God has put into our lives. That goes especially for the things we value most.

Now refer back to your top-five list. For each, consider these questions:

- Why is this item in the top five?
- How well am I caring for this?

Special Congregational Forum Minutes

The meeting was opened with prayer at 10:14 AM by President Paul Behrens.

An anonymous donation was given to the church to install a new HVAC system into the SON room. A vote will be taken at the August 7 meeting on this. No questions were asked regarding this. THANK YOU to the donors for this wonderful gift.

Paul explained the differences between the Articles, By-Laws and Continuing Resolutions. Our Constitution should be designed to keep consistency.

The team worked hard to incorporate the By-laws and Articles together into this Constitution.

David Susie asked about Article 4-Bylaw 1-section c regarding voting members and how those are tracked. He also asked about Article 6 – Discipline of Members and if this was really needed.

Dave Simington commented about the handling of Bylaws vs. Articles and how they are different and if we should keep them separate. In combining the 2, we are hoping to make things easier to find.

David Susie commented on Article 9-section A9.03 & A9.04 regarding how they searched for a pastoral candidate and if a church vote is required to obtain an interim pastor. He also discussed the count of 9 members on the call team and maybe increase that to 15 as you don't always have all members active on the call team. We just need to make sure the 9 we have are committed. Dave also discussed the 7-9 votes to present the candidate vs. a unanimous vote.

Becky Simons explained how the revision committee was comprised of people from the different groups of prior Constitution committees and current council members (voting & non-voting).

Rachel Simington asked for clarification on A9.03 as well & Pastor Ben answered her concern.

Dave Simington commented on Article 13-A13.02 regarding an Executive Team. Dave brought up examples of other churches that had a very controlling Executive Team that was detrimental to those churches. Paul explained our Executive Team's purpose and that they really don't have much "power" and their purpose is to help guide the Council. Pastor Ben explained that our Executive Team has no voting rights so they really can't do anything other than support the Council. Our President is limited to a one year term as well which makes it difficult to be "controlling". David Susie suggested a checks & balances to the Team. Karen Brandt spoke to the Executive Board having the ability to come up with recommendations to run by the Council and believe they have a little bit of influence but that the Council has the ultimate vote on things. Patty Ellsworth commented about adding people and that there shouldn't be family members both on these Teams. Kay Iverson commented that it was set up to have a small group of people on the Executive Team to address items that would require immediate attention.

Paul addressed A13.17 and if there should be an increase in the amount of projects. Dave Simington asked the question about if this is included in an interim pastor situation. Discussion on having the Council appoint an interim pastor and not presenting to the Congregation. Ross Brockshus discussed some clarification of the Call Committee search for a pastor and an intentional interim and their role.



Becky noted that Article 14 was completed by contacting each team and that as the Teams change, they have moved items to the Continuing Resolutions out of the Bylaws to help make these changes without changing the whole Constitution.

The Proposed Continuing Resolutions have the Bylaws for each team along with the Teams. Becky suggested changing the Bylaw naming to CR for Continuing Resolution and that was agreed upon by the Congregation.

Article 20 sections refer to Congregation Council so may want to change the verbiage on that to just Council.

Paul recommended changing Standing Task Team verbiage by adding Standing to A14.13, 14 & 15.

Leah Kreutner asked if there was a cap or limit of how many teams or ways any one member can serve as not to overload them or control issues. There is nothing in place at this time. Discussion on getting new members involved and ASK them how they would like to serve.

Paul commended the team that has reviewed the Constitution, Bylaws & Continuing Resolutions: Barb Enge, Matt Essick, Becky Simons, Kay Iverson.

Paul closed the meeting at 11:08 AM.
