VIA de CRISTO is a Spanish phrase meaning "Way of Christ." It is a combined effort of lay people and clergy toward renewal of the church.

Purpose of VIA de CRISTO

VIA de CRISTO is based on the fundamentals of Christianity, concentrating on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ. The focus is not on VIA de CRISTO itself, but on the environment of the community of believers. The objective of the movement is to inspire, challenge and equip people for Christian action in their homes, churches and communities.

Jesus said He came to earth to "seek and save the lost." And right before He left He said, "As the Father sent Me, now I'm sending you."

God wants us to become contagious Christians - His agents, who will first catch His love and then urgently and infectiously offer it to all who are willing to consider it. This is His primary plan, the one Jesus modeled so powerfully, to spread God's grace and truth person to person until there's an epidemic of changed lives around the world.





COUNCIL MEETING | December 11, 2019

Members present: Radina Jansen, Courtney Schwartz, Paul Behrens, Korrie Anderson, Larry Wigen, Jim Unrau, Kent Heazlett, Kirby Fueston, LaVonne Clark, Lois Christman, Al Vanderberg, Kyle Rouse, Pete Crew, Pastor Lee, Cindy Tigges, Kay Iversen and Barb Enge.

Korrie Anderson opened with prayer and a devotion. President Kyle Rouse called the meeting to order.

November minutes were reviewed with a motion to accept from Courtney Schwartz and second from Kirby Fueston. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

The financial report for November was presented by Larry Wigen. A motion to accept was made by Al Vanderberg and second from Radina Jansen. Motion carried by unanimous vote. The Financial Reports are attached. Larry Wigen shared a chart that showed a five year average of giving. He also presented a proposed 2020 budget prepared by the Financial Team. Following discussion a motion from Al Vanderberg to accept the proposed 2020 budget with staff increases to be presented for approval at the Annual Meeting with a second from Kirby Fueston. Motion carried by unanimous vote. Changes to the budget are as follows: Pastor Lee \$93,281, Eric Patten \$34,328, Denise Laaveg \$18,180, Cheryl Stueven \$16,228, Rich Stueven \$4,557 and Lori Krei \$41,612.

The additions to the budget brings total administrative expenses to \$306,353 and overall budget total is \$395,364.

Pete Crew reported for the LifeKids Task Team. A board of three will be needed to monitor the program. Courtney Schwartz plus two more people will serve on that board. It is anticipated that a director of the program will be in place by June 1, 2020.

Paul Behrens, representing the Properties Team, reports that the garage is cleaned out. They are ready to choose a few ideas on the design of the front of the building and will let the congregation vote for their preference. These designs won't be ready until early next year.

Nominating Committee – They have selected the following people for team openings to be confirmed at the Annual Meeting.

Music and Creative Arts – Brett & Jolynne Eilts Finance – Becky Simons Discipleship – Randy Enge Youth Ministry – Remains open Properties – Mark Speidel

A motion from Lois Christman to nominate Larry Wigen as Vice President and a second from Radina Jansen resulted in unanimous approval. Pete Crew has accepted the nomination for President and these will be voted on at the Annual Meeting.

Stewardship Team is planning a pancake benefit for Tracy Bengtson and Keith Van Kleek possibly in February.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Kirby Fueston with a second from Korrie Anderson.

Becoming More Like God

Ever heard of Jon M.

Huntsman? He is a billionaire who gave \$100 million dollars to help find a cure for cancer. Huntsman has gone through two bouts of cancer himself. He had prostate cancer in 1992



and then cancer of the mouth in 1993.

Huntsman could be a poster boy for old-fashioned values. He grew up in what he describes as a "humble and modest" home in Blackfoot, Idaho, the second of three sons of a schoolteacher and his wife.

How did he make his billion dollars? One major reason was the "Big Mac" plastic burger box for McDonald's. Prior to that, it was the egg carton, then plastic bowls and plates for hospital use. His companies are in 23 different countries. Huntsman said, "I never dreamed that I would be in this position financially someday, nor did our family ever expect it, nor do I think, frankly, that we deserve it."

"But it's unfolded in such an incredible way," Huntsman continued, "I feel maybe the good Lord intended me to utilize it for the betterment of human-kind. There's no better explanation for someone to have picked potatoes as a kid and suddenly have a \$4 to \$5 billion dollar company in one lifetime."

Huntsman has done a good thing. *His giving has apparently been motivated by a gracious God.* And so must our giving be.

When we give, we are most like God. Giving is one of the hardest things for most people to do, because we are taking away from ourselves. And self is very strong in all of us. We hoard. We are afraid that we will not have enough. Self often dominates and controls, preventing us from giving in love like God.

As the 2020 year begins, pray for the Lord of love to guide your giving. Ask God to transform your mind about giving. As you give, trust God to provide. Pray to become more like God and Christ, who have given their all for us and to us.



The New Year has started and everyone has set their new New Year's Resolution goals with hopes for accomplishment. Going
