Walking in the Son's Light

I love spring, and I love bright sunny days which lift our spirits.

French poet, Gerard de Nerval, wrote, "Every flower is a soul blossoming in nature." It is a romantic vision of reality. I'd like to turn the phrase over and say, "Every soul is like a flower blossoming in the Son's Light."

We continue to celebrate the truth that Jesus is raised from the dead. He is alive to bless us each day with His love. He shines His light on us, and "in His light, we see light" (Psalm 36:9). In the light of Jesus, our souls can blossom in beauty to become all that He intends us to be. We are at our vivid best when we walk in Jesus' light. The scriptures are full of this imagery.

"The people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned" (Matthew 4:16 quoting Isaiah 9). Before our faith came alive to trust Jesus, we walked in darkness – both ignorance and immorality. Now the light has dawned. Jesus love shines on us. We now walk in newness of life.

Jesus is the Light of the world. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5). Jesus' Spirit illumines our soul, our spirit. Light always dispels the darkness. Jesus' presence purges our souls of all that is inappropriate and wrong.

"Your Word is a lamp for my feet, and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105). Walking with Jesus, we bask in His light, and we know the way to live. If we go back to living in the darkness, we have stopped following Jesus, and we have left the Light.

"This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:5-9). The only way for our lives to blossom with beauty, and become all that God intends is to continually walk in the Son's light.

Finally, Jesus' Spirit within us allows His light to shine through us, like the beauty of a stained glass window in a cathedral. "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16).

International Mission Trip to Mexico City!





Faith is moving forward to launch a major ministry expansion this August. Our LifeKids program, which has blessed and loved children each Wednesday in an afterschool program, is now expanding to a full week, Monday through Friday program. Our goal is to bless families in the Spencer community by sharing the love of Jesus with children grades K - 5 each day afterschool, while providing a safe, fun, educational environment.

This is a BIG step. It is a wonderful vision for ministry. It truly serves the community in love. But it takes a great deal of organization, preparation, intentionality, and money. Yes, money. Ministry for the Lord always requires the generosity of God's people to make it happen.

So, you are invited to become a LifeKids Supporter! In order to have the adequate staffing,

recreational equipment, art and educational supplies, and all the other necessities to birth this ministry vision, we estimate that it will cost approximately \$1,200 per child each year.

Each family enrolling their children will pay tuition. But, many families cannot afford the tuition costs, or they cannot afford the whole amount. Much like a college financial assistance program, we need a pool of money, which will

empower all children to come to our LifeKids program.

Faith needs a significant group of people willing to give toward our LifeKids program over and above our general congregational ministry and mission. Would you prayerfully consider sponsoring a child by giving \$100 per month? Perhaps you cannot do \$100, but you still believe in this program for children and you wish to be a LifeKids Supporter. Could you give some lesser amount each month to this LifeKids program in addition to your regular giving to Faith?

I believe that God's Spirit has guided us to this ministry program. I believe God will provide for it, through the generosity of His people. I ask you to pray about whether you are one of the families who can help us to do this. Then, the children of Spencer will hear about the Bible stories and learn of the love of Jesus Christ through our LifeKids program.



These funds will, of course, be tracked as the fundraising team's project so dollar totals are regularly available.
