Is Faith church successful?

In normal discussion at our last Faith Council meeting in July, we

spent some time reflecting on an interesting statistic from our congregation's records. In the last five years, while membership continues to grow, our average Sunday morning worship attendance is decreasing. Why? Symptomatically, what does the smaller number of regular worshippers tell us? Perhaps the larger question is, "How do we measure "success" as a congregation, as a local "body of Christ?"

The local congregation is a spiritual organism, not an organization, and not a business. Statistics do not tell the whole story, but they tell us something. What is decreased worship attendance telling us? Are Sunday morning worship numbers alone the exclusive measure of spiritual success?

As your pastor, honestly the first question I ask myself is -- Am I doing a faithful job as Faith's pastor? Am I still the right leader? Am I still effective in my role as the congregation's spiritual shepherd? Though moments of self-doubt flow through me, and though I am far from perfect, I do not believe that the success or struggle of a congregation is the pastor's alone. I pray that I am faithful in sharing the message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, week in and week out. I pray that I am working with congregational leadership to implement the strategic plan that the congregation affirmed as our mutual short-term goal.

Here are some questions I offer to broaden our definition of success . . .

How many worshippers attend each Sunday morning? Do our members attend regularly and faithfully?

What percentage of our members have daily devotions to read God's Word and pray?

What percentage of our members attend Bible study to continue to grow and deepen in faith and the knowledge of God's Word?

How many members participate in "journey teams" or "faith friendships" to grow strong through the study of the Word, fellowship, faith dialogue, and prayer?

How many members serve within the congregation's ministry as volunteers in some capacity beyond Sunday worship? Or, how many members serve as volunteers in the community? Are the lay people of Faith carrying out the ministry of Jesus in daily life?

What is the level of giving financially per member to our congregation's fiscal needs? Is our congregation generous?

How many programs does our congregation have which bless and serve our community of Spencer?

Is our congregation's membership growing?

Does every member of Faith invite others to worship?

Do the members of Faith share their personal God-story with others?

The way to measure "success" is diverse, especially in the area of spiritual vitality. Pray for Faith, pray for her leaders, for her pastor, for her staff. Please feel free to share your thoughts, concerns, hopes and opinions with me or with any of our council members.

I am praying that the Lord continues to guide us as we seek to shine for Him!



THE 411 On This Fall's Events!

The Children's Ministry Team tells all about this Fall's lineup.

Blessing the Students will be August 18 - during the 9:00 a.m. Worship service. We will bless the children on their upcoming school year and the anticipation of their new adventure. We

have backpack clips for them to put on their backpacks to remember that they are children of God.

<u>Rally Day will be held August 25</u> - Students will do a scavenger hunt for items needed for their classrooms (scissors, markers, posters, crayons, glue sticks and Bibles). Once the items are gathered by each child they will go to their classroom, meet their Sunday School teacher, give the items they found to their teacher and become acquainted with the room. The children could possibly make something in the room with their name to "mark" the room as theirs!

<u>Sunday School will begin with September</u> - September 1, 8 and 15, the first three Sundays of Sunday School, will be a large group format focusing on "Creation."

Our first Sunday we will have a video displaying God's creation.

The second Sunday we will ask a member of Faith to share their faith story.

The third Sunday is a hands-on activity where the children "create" something with God in mind.

<u>Sunday School Curriculum will be centered on ShareFaith</u> - After the first three Sundays we will begin our new classroom format. The plan to use this curriculum through the next three years. In doing so, we will lead the children through the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation.

How the Sunday School hour will progress - We will start Sunday School off in the Kids Common area with music, watch a video and start dialog on the lesson for the day. Once that is completed the children will then move into their classroom where their teachers will reaffirm the lesson and have dialog, crafts and activities.

<u>A Note to the Sunday School Teachers</u> - Teacher orientation will be August 18 at 10:30 a.m. This is the same day as Blessing the Students. We will meet in the church library.

Teacher Installation will be August 25. It is the same day as Rally Day.

<u>Bible Presentation will be September 22</u> - With Sunday School class time starting on September 22, we want to be sure to equip the children of Faith with their own Bible to bring to class. Sunday School teachers will distribute Bibles to their students: First year Preschool, Kindergarten and 2nd grade.



CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING | JULY 10, 2019 | 7:30 P.M.

Members present: Paul Behrens, Korrie Anderson, Larry Wigen, Jim Unrau, Kirby Fueston, LaVonne Clark, Kyle Rouse, Pastor Lee, Lori Krei, Cindy Tigges, Kay Iversen and Barb Enge.

President Kyle Rouse called the meeting to order. Pastor Lee opened the meeting with a prayer. The meeting did not have a quorum so minutes and financials could not be voted on.

Missions Team set a goal of providing 100 food baskets and any additional money to be used for dentist supplies and glasses. Del Brockshus has donated Charin's memorial money to go toward the Mexico Mission Trip. Members of the Mission Trip Team will be commissioned on Sunday, July 14.

Lori Krei updated us on the Leadercast event. Twenty-three participants attended. May 7, 2020, is set as the date for next year. The purchase of 75 tickets is planned. Several new companies are interested in getting involved in the coming year.

LCMC lowa District Annual Gathering is scheduled to be held November 9, 2019, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Attendance averages around 50 people and Faith Lutheran has been asked to host this event. We previously had Leadership Retreat scheduled for that date, but are willing to change for this opportunity to serve. A committee will be set up to facilitate the Gathering.

Committee Updates:

- *Worship Team is in need of additional volunteers for the Children's Messages on Sunday mornings. A Temple Talk may be helpful in recruiting for this need.
- *Children's Ministry reports many Faith Lutheran children attended Bible School. Preparations for the Christmas program have already begun.
- *Evangelism Team will possibly have 20 new members interested in joining Faith. They are also looking to provide the congregation with new name tags.
- *Leadership Support Team is finalizing the personnel handbook and will meet in August.
- *Technology Team announced the new sound system and microphones are scheduled for installation in August. They are also planning for new computers.
- *Properties Team reports the air conditioning has been turned on in the new offices. A cleaning day has been scheduled to vacuum the ceilings. Also rocks in the parking lot need attention. Lunch will be provided for the volunteers.
- *Fellowship Team is planning for Ingham Lake service the first Sunday in August. St. John's will be invited to join us. Paul Behrens will bring gas grill and everyone is asked to bring a dish to share. In the past there has been approximately 125 people in attendance.

A report concerning the average attendance dating back to 2015: There was a lengthy discussion concerning the declining attendance. Discussion resulted in a few ideas but no decisions were made to remedy the situation.

The Fifth Gaspel

What does it mean to share your faith in Jesus Christ with someone?

Do you share your faith through words, or actions? Are people led to Christ by hearing



a preacher give a message during worship, or by watching how you live your life at work every day? Do people come to the foot of the cross by receiving an evangelism card that leads them on the Romans Road to salvation, or by hearing someone shouting the gospel on the street corner? Do people come to Christ by going to a backyard barbeque hosted by their friend, who shares with everyone what God's doing in their life, and how their life is changed because of Him? Do people come to know the Gospel by receiving a Christian book from a friend, with a heartfelt note in the front? Do people give their life to Christ because they are looking for hope, and someone brings it to them? Do people find God's saving grace because someone shared God's love through a batch of homemade cookies?

Now let me ask you ... how did God find you? How did He speak to your heart to draw you closer to Him? Did someone speak to you about Jesus, or did you watch someone's life and actions and say, "I want what he or she has." Did someone preach it? Did someone share God's love? Did someone share their "God Story" with you? What led you to Him?

To answer the questions above, I would say that all of these ways can be avenues that people hear or see the Gospel, and are led to Christ. Never doubt the power of your words and actions. In truth, both are needed at the right time and in the right way. So step out and share your faith with others, and be Jesus to everyone. You are His hands and feet.

In September we will begin a Worship series about sharing our faith with others. In October there will be an adult education class after Worship geared around the book "Becoming a Contagious Christian." Learn how to live in a way that others desire Christ because of who you are and how you live.

I will leave you with one final quote. "There are five Gospels. Most people don't read the first four Gospels in the New Testament. They read the fifth Gospel ... You. They read you. You are the fifth Gospel."

Ten Reasons to Give Generously

In 2 Corinthians 9:6-15, Paul gives us at least ten reasons to give generously:

- 1. It is the *best investment* you can make Like the harvest, giving is planting seed. The farmer will reap far more than what was sown (v.6): 'A stingy planter gets a stingy crop; a lavish planter gets a lavish crop' (v.6, MSG). This applies to everything in life. What you give to the Lord he multiplies your time, gifts, ambitions and money.
- 2. **It should be** *fun* **-** Giving should never be forced or grudging, but rather voluntary and cheerful. 'Let each one give as he has made up his own mind and purposed in his heart, not reluctantly or sorrowfully or under compulsion, for God loves (He takes pleasure in, prizes above all other things, and is unwilling to abandon or to do without) a cheerful (joyous, "prompt to do it") giver whose heart is in his giving' (v.7, AMP). The Greek word for cheerful is *hilaros*. It should be fun to give.
- 3. **It takes away** *the burden of financial worry* Paul writes, 'and God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having *all that you need*, you will abound in every good work' (v.8). Giving does not mean handing over financial responsibility to God but it does mean handing over the worry and the burden of it.
- 4. **It 'enriches'** you When God invites us to give, he is pleading to our reason, not to our emotions: 'Thus you will be enriched in all things and in every way so that you can be generous' (v.11, AMP). Materially, we will have enough to give away generously (v.11). Our characters will be enriched (v.10). God will be praised (v.11).
- 5. It *transforms your character* Paul speaks of 'the harvest of your righteousness' (v.10b). Giving purges the character from the constricting grip of materialism that destroys lives.

Ten Reasons to Give Generously

- 6. It *inspires others* 'Your generosity will result in *thanksgiving* to God. This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of God's people but it is also overflowing in the many expressions of *thanks* to God. Because of the service of which you approved yourselves, people will praise God' (vv.11b–13a).
- 7. **It meets people's needs** Generous giving blesses other people and supplies the needs of God's people 'helping meet the bare needs of poor Christians' (v.12, MSG).
- 8. **It is** *evidence of real faith* Generous giving is an act of obedience, which should accompany 'your confession of the gospel of Christ' (v.13). Giving is an act of trust in doing it we are saying that it is God, not ourselves or anyone else, who ultimately provides for our needs.
- 9. It makes you a stakeholder in the church Paul speaks of 'your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else' (v.13b). The word Paul uses for sharing is koinonia which can also be translated 'fellowship'. In the same way as when you share an apartment you share in the bills, as you share in the needs of the community you reap the benefits of that community. For example, every time someone comes to know Christ through the community you share in the blessing.
- **10.** It is a response to God's gift to you Our giving is a response to God's amazing grace. His 'indescribable gift' (v.15) is the gift of his Son. 'Thank God for this gift, His gift. No language can praise it enough!' (v.15, MSG).

Lord, thank you for your surpassing grace, which abounds towards us. Thank you for the indescribable gift of your son Jesus Christ who died for us and rose again. Help us to respond with generosity and grace to your amazing grace.
