Friends of Madagascar Missions

Pastor David Lerseth, executive director of Friends of Madagascar Missions (FOMM), has, in years past, visited our congregation to speak about this ministry which the Faith Mission Team decided to support in 2020.

Missions Team

Madagascar is the world's fourth largest island and is

located just east of the African continent. In 1866 two Norwegian missionaries founded a Lutheran church in central Madagascar. With many Lutheran congregations established in the following years, the Malagasy Lutheran Church was founded in 1950 to unite 1800 congregations. FOMM raises funds and works with the Malagasy Church to identify projects needing support to spread the gospel of Jesus and help people in poverty.

The current projects that FOMM is supporting are a Bible school for evangelists, a hospital nutrition

feeding center, a prison ministry, and a drip irrigation project. The two year Bible schools teach evangelists the basics of Christianity and send them out to rural villages that have no churches.

The government of Madagascar doesn't provide enough food for prisoners so this ministry brings food as well as the gospel to the prisoners. They have also started a vocational program and a crafts program to generate support.

In Africa, a hospital patient's family must provide and prepare the patient's food while in the hospital. FOMM helps to provide quality food for these families and to talk to families about Jesus.

The south west part of Madagascar is semi-arid. It is either "feast or famine" regarding the crops that are grown by the farmers. The goal is to teach the farmers how to use a drip irrigation system during the times of drought and crop failure. This system would allow them to raise enough food to feed their family during dry periods of time and also have some crop produce left over to sell at their local markets.

Wrapped in Love Weighted Blankets

Wrapped in Love Weighted Blankets is a mission project of Faith Lutheran that is not too well known by many.

We started making the blankets in October of 2014 to give, free of charge, to Faith members. So far, we have given 31 blankets away. We have given 22 blankets to the Department of Human Services at no charge.

Before COVID-19, we were a group of women and men working together. We would meet for a work day, complete with coffee breaks and a noon lunch. Since COVID-19, two ladies are making blankets for Autumn's Center in Spencer. We have given the Center 32 blankets. That makes a total of 85 free blankets!

These blankets require 2 yards of cotton fabric for the top and 2 yards for the back. There are 104



pockets that are each filled with about ¼ cup of very small plastic pellets. It takes a 4-quart ice cream pail of pellets for each blanket. We were able to purchase 1,000 pounds of pellets from a source in Pella, Iowa. They are stored in Dave Simington's climate-controlled building.

We also make weighted lap pillows that require two pieces of fabric that measure 18 inches x 20 inches each. These pillows help give comfort, peace and quiet. We have given 20 of them to various people, plus to Spencer Schools and Autumn's Center.

After the items for the kitchen were purchased with bake sale funds, we have purchased fabric and pellets with the money. *Wrapped in Love Weighted Blankets* is another fun project for Faith Lutheran and a way to share God's love with others.

These days peace on earth is hard to find And I need You to remind me one more time.


You're still the hope of Christmas You're still the Light when the world looks dark You're still the hope of Christmas And You're still the hope of my heart.

Christian Giving: Christian Giving is Management of God's Money

This is the second of four articles on giving by J.I. Packer, Professor of Theology at Regents College, British Columbia.

When we set ourselves to think about Christian money management, in whatever connection, from buying groceries to supporting missionaries to investing in industry to financing a holiday, the first thing we have to get clear on is that the money that is ours to manage is not ours, but God's. Yes, we have been given it to use, but it remains his. We have it as a loan, and in due course we must give account to him of what we have done with it.

That is the point of the word stewardship, which nowadays is in effect the church's label for the discipline of giving. A steward is someone whom an owner entrusts with the managing of his assets. An investment manager is a steward: he has control of his clients' assets in one sense, but his job is to understand and implement his clients' wishes and priorities regarding their use. In the same way, a trustee is a steward: his job is to invest, safeguard, and disburse the money in the trust according to the stated purpose of whoever appointed him.

Society (which Scripture calls "the world") sees each person's money as his own possession, to use as he likes. Scripture, however, sees our money as a trust from God, to be used for his glory. In the Holy Communion liturgy in the Anglican Book of Common Prayer, the collection is offered to God with the words: "All that is in the heaven and in the earth is thine. All things come of thee, and of *thine own have we given thee*" (words taken from 1 Chronicles. 29:11, 14). Such is the constant biblical perspective. The money that is ordinarily thought of as ours remains God's; we receive it from his hand as his stewards and trustees, and must learn to manage it for his praise.

"When Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him, asking for help." - Matthew 8:5


