There is a big difference between *knowing about* someone and *knowing* someone. I think that the Apostle Paul is talking this way when he writes, "Grace and peace be yours in abundance through **the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord**. His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through **our knowledge of him** who called us by his own glory and goodness" (2 Peter 1:2-3).

At the gate of heaven there will *not* be a trivia quiz. There will *not* be an essay test on theology. Jesus will declare, "I never knew you" (Matthew7:23), or "Come and share your master's happiness" (Matthew 25:23). Some will enter, never having had the privilege of holding a Bible or entering a church building—but they trust the good news of Jesus that was told to them. They have called on his name every day and loved him and served him. They know Jesus!

On Ash Wednesday, February 22, we start our pilgrimage to Easter. We will begin "The 18-Inch Journey" – the journey from your head to your heart. You know so many things about Jesus! We will open ourselves for God to transform facts into faith, to shift from knowing about to personal knowing, from explanation to trust.





Meet Your Missions: Falls Community Church

Falls Community Church is a sister church to Faith Lutheran. When Pastor Julius Badigo was asked how their church began, he stated that God had a purpose for them to expand His territory in North America as they came as refugees from different countries in Africa and met in Sioux Falls, South Dakota (the coldest state in America). They had no idea how cold the state was but by His grace they are trying and thriving.

In 2001, the congregation met under the name of Sudanese Congregations at St. Mark's Lutheran Church ELCA. Due to the break up in the ELCA church in 2009, they moved out of St. Mark's and held their worship services in several different churches in Sioux Falls. In 2010, they registered their new church under the current name of Falls Community Church and became members of LCMC in 2011.

The congregation purchased the church where they are currently located in 2014 and finished the payment for the church in 2018.

This is the first South Sudanese church in North America. They are so proud and excited to have



their building. "We give God the honor and the Glory for His wonderful work for us as refugees came to Sioux Falls, South Dakota and it became our home so that we can preach and teach the Words of God to our children at large. We also thank God for Faith Lutheran Church for our sister church to recognize us." Their mission is to win souls for Christ right here on Earth.

The Faith Lutheran Missions Team discussed getting a Mission Project together to help Falls Community Church with their vision in improving their church. (Watch for more news to come.)

Do you know your true calling? Each and every one of us, as Christians, has a unique place in God's Kingdom. When we seek to love and serve the



As a worship director, I spend a lot of time planning for and leading our worship services. This position has so many blessings that go with it, and perhaps the most obvious is the purpose of my job revolves around praising God - how amazing is that! However, because I am always up front leading worship, I don't often get the opportunity to fully worship God myself with others around me. What I can do, however, is worship God on my own. When I'm alone in my apartment, I'll put on a Spotify playlist and sing along, or just listen, and let the words and melody bring refreshment to my soul.

The summer of 2021, I discovered a song by Jon Guerra that I fell in love with. It's called 'Kingdom of God' and I would encourage you to listen to it if you get a chance. The song beautifully weaves together 2 main Scripture passages, starting with the Beatitudes from Matthew 5, and then the 23rd Psalm a bit later in the song. I've included the chorus for you to read:

"Blessed are the poor who have nothing to own Blessed are the mourners who are crying alone Blessed are the guilty who have nowhere to go

For their hearts have a road to the kingdom of God And their souls are the songs of the kingdom of God And they will find a refuge for theirs is the kingdom of God"

- Jon Guerra, 'Kingdom of God'

The way Jon rephrases the words of the Beatitudes allows God to speak to me in a way that resonates with my spirit, not just my brain. I can feel the heart of God toward those who are mourning, or poor, or hungering for righteousness. As I listen to the words, I realize sometimes I can fit in one or more of those categories. And God's response to me is the same as it is to all the others Jesus mentioned: the Kingdom of God is ours. The Kingdom of God is where we will find peace. The Kingdom of God allows us to feel safe. The Kingdom of God is where we can live with God, so close that we breathe the same air and live in the very presence of God.

Worship here on earth can give us a taste of heaven- how our souls will be filled, and we will feel the most at home that we ever have. Worship allows us to experience the Kingdom of God - and we can also experience the Kingdom of God when we act as Jesus' hands and feet, doing His work for God's glory. We are all welcome in God's Kingdom. If you find yourself feeling empty and in need of something more, that is exactly when God can place His Kingdom in your spirit. May you be blessed, friends. The Kingdom of God is ours.



Andy went through the rules with the kids, put on and secured the harnesses, hooked them up to the ropes, gave encouragement, gave suggestions for hand and foot placement, and unhooked them. All the children attempted to climb multiple paths on the tower as some of the paths were more difficult. They'd climb, take a rest so others could have their turn and then go back at it. Ring-a-ling! Both Josh and Sydney scaled to the top and rang the bell! It was great to see all the enthusiasm and everyone's willingness to be challenged!











The children loved the pool. They told me it was not cold! The pool was a zero-entry pool so it was great for our younger LifeKids. A big LifeKids "Thank you!" goes out to Eric for hanging out in the pool with both groups! Group 2 shared the pool with some of the Y Kids, but Group 1 had the pool all to themselves. A great time was had by all!











The impending storm on Wednesday Jan. 18, affected the number of children we had for our dessert baking day for Grand Ave. Community Outreach. We started with 6 children and 3 children finished mixing, spreading, and baking the brownies. Before mixing the brownies, we read through the recipe as a group, making sure they understood what a whisk was and how to use it, and how to be at eye level when measuring the milk. I demonstrated how they needed to gently glide over the batter with a spoon to spread it to the edges, otherwise the batter wouldn't stay in place due to the spray we put on the parchment paper. Since there were only 3 children when the brownies were ready to be baked, they got to lick the brownie batter off the utensils they used! A big LifeKids "Thank You!" goes out to Gloria for helping with our once-a-month community service baking project for Grand Avenue Community Outreach!

Ash Wednesday's Wake-up Call by Rev. Robert Blezard

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

With these words from Genesis 3:19 and the swipe of a dirty thumb across our foreheads, Ash Wednesday propels us into Lent with the proper context to understand our lives as stewards of all that God entrusts to us.

Ash Wednesday, which falls on Feb. 22, teaches us that we are mortals, after all. It crushes our ego, dispels our pretentions and drives us deep into God's mysteries: Why are we here? What are our lives all about? What's really important? Pray over these questions and profound insights emerge.

We are dust.

Yes, but we are God's dust. Our body consists of trillions of atoms, each a speck of "dust" created by God billions of years ago. God put us together from the stuff of the universe.

- Therefore, we are quite literally "earthy" beings, made of the same material as air, water, soil and stone. As part of creation, we work to preserve, protect and sustain creation.
- Therefore, we have reverence for our bodies, expressed through healthy living.

We are breath

We are "dust" into which God has "breathed the Holy breath of life" (Genesis 2:7).

- Therefore, every breath we take is holy, reminding us of God's life force in us.
- Therefore, we look to God to align our lives with God's holy realities of peace, love, joy, justice and truth.

Our time is brief

Our "dust" will return to the earth someday. We are mortal.

- Therefore, every hour, every second is sacred. We spend our time wisely, carefully, prayerfully.
- Therefore, we do not cling to possessions, knowing that we hold onto them only for a little while.
- Therefore, we fill our lives with treasures of lasting value friendships, trust, love, joy, service, generosity and harmony.

This Lent, spend time in prayer, with openness and honesty. See how God will turn your heart and mind, transforming you into the person you were created to be. Reflect each day as on Ash Wednesday. "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."
