We will also discuss who is blessed more when we give. The giver or the recipient of the gift?



Meet Your Missions: International Messengers



The concept of International Messengers (IM) actually took place in the mind and heart of Robert Rasmusson in 1980. IM became an independent, nonprofit mission organization in 1989. The offices were moved to Clear Lake, Iowa, in 1992.

IM set out to provide effective cross-cultural, short-term missions experiences for college-age students and adults. This pursuit led to a new and innovative ministry concept called Evangelistic English Language Camps (EELC), born in 1985 with a camp in Austria. The camps were expanded to Communist Poland the following year and then began in Hong Kong and other Eastern European countries from 1987 – 1992.

In 1990 IM started offering 2-1/2 week opportunities aimed at involving adult lay people and impacting the local church. Winter camps began in 1991 for the same purpose. At about the same time, IM started to focus on recruiting church teams, where all the team members were from one church. The number of people involved in these English camp teams has grown annually from 15 in the beginning to over 200 at present. In the late 90's the concept continued to expand into medical, nursing, educational and professional English camps which have had an effect on the adult population of Central & Eastern Europe.

The ministries of our cross-cultural staff include Bible study and discipleship, children-at-risk ministry, cooking class outreach, evangelism through English teaching, jail ministry, marriage and parenting outreach, medical ministry, men's accountability ministry, ministry to people with HIV, ministry to the elderly, ministry to the homeless/addicts, ministry through business, motorcycle ministry, Native American and First Nations ministry, outreach to businessmen, outreach to sextrafficked girls and women, planting and pastoring churches, refugee ministry, Roma ministry through adult education, therapy using dogs and horses, translation of discipleship material, university student outreach, women and children-at-risk ministry, and youth ministry.

We anxiously wait to see God's plans unfold for IM in the coming years.

Men's Mental Health

Did you know that over 6 million men suffer from depression each year which is often undiagnosed? Men are more likely to report fatigue, irritability, loss of interest in work or hobbies, rather than feelings of sadness or worthlessness. Approximately 19.1 million American adults

ages 18 to 54 have an anxiety disorder. Three million men have a panic disorder, agoraphobia, or any other phobia.

Male suicides have been on the rise since 2000, becoming the 7th leading cause of death among males. More than 4 times as many men as women die by suicide and the highest rates in the US are found in Caucasian men over the age of 85. Risk factors for suicide include social isolation, substance abuse, unemployment, military-related trauma, genetic predisposition, and mood disorders.

Men who serve as providers, protectors, and active members in their families and communities, may become overwhelmed with the full weight of their responsibilities. God reminds in Joshua 1:9 of how to cope with these feelings. "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (NIV)

Reaching out to supportive people within your circle of loved ones, your pastor, a counselor, your physician, or a trusted coach or mentor, are great first steps to get the support needed to face daily and more unique circumstances. God's peace and our wellbeing can be more readily attained by knowing our worth as His child and defining our purpose with the help of His grace and mercy. The Bible tells us through Paul's writing in 1 Corinthians 15:58: "Therefore my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." (NIV)

Text giving – Again, the first gift requires an account signup, but after that it is easy peasy. Text "giving" to 712-214-4317 and you can use the following keywords for your donation: general, gift, mission, lifekids. Five different options (4 of them automated) to whichever way you are most comfortable in giving. We just really appreciate receiving regular gifts because it helps our bookkeeping go smoothly and our bank accounts to be active in the best ways possible!

The bank account doesn't get depleted as quickly and little surprises may just appear in unexpected ways. Paul explained the sign that we are looking at. The blue top portion of the sign will stay as is. The white portion of the sign is what will be replaced. Rich Stueven currently changes the words on the sign and the sign is warped and letters don't stay in. Bulbs are difficult to replace and the bulbs will soon be obsolete.

The digital sign the properties team is looking at a sign out of California. The sign will be about the same size as what is currently there. There is an 11 year life without issues if ran 24 hours/day. Lifetime tech support and 5 year warranty will come with it. There are thousands of colors available, you can have up to 7 lines and can be programmed from inside the church. Toft Electric would be available to assist if there are issues. Lead time would be 2-3 weeks.

SMU & Toft Electric bill will be about \$11,000 for the work to run the wires to the sign. The sign itself costs around \$22,000 & \$2,000 for the installation. Total estimated costs is \$35,000. An anonymous party has come forward to pay the balance remaining to fund the sign so the sign will be fully funded. Paul encouraged the congregation to still donate so it wouldn't be so much for this party.

G.A. Darnell motioned to approve the sign purchase with Jim Paulson seconding the motion.

Vote was 109 yes, 6 no. Motion carried & the new sign will be ordered.
