



I recently heard the song Sound of Heaven for the first time and was eager to incorporate it into the repertoire at Faith. It's a powerful anthem inviting the presence of God to come dwell among us, as well as a declaration of our surrender to and desire for the will of God. The chorus is as follows:

Bring the sound of heaven
Let Your mighty wind come rushing through
Lord, our hearts are open
With the saints and angels, we sing to You
Come have Your way, come have Your way

Have you ever had a worship experience that gave you a taste of Heaven? One where you felt the Presence of the Holy Spirit moving in the room, or in your heart? This song is a cry for the Spirit to move in us and in our world. I appreciate the imagery in this song of the *sound of heaven*. Can you imagine what that sound is like? The *saints and angels* singing constant praises to the God who is worthy of it all. And one day, we will get a chance to participate in this intimate worship of our holy, loving, powerful God.

Inviting the Holy Spirit to come be present in our worship is an important acknowledgement, but simultaneously a bit redundant. As believers, the Spirit indwells us, so when we "invite" Him, He is already among us. The song Holy Spirit sums the invitation up well in the line, *Let us become more aware of your Presence*. Our "invitation" is not what prompts the Presence of God to come be among us; rather, it is a reminder to ourselves that He is already here, and a declaration of surrender to His power and will.

The Scriptures in the lectionary over the last few weeks have focused on the idea of giving up everything to follow Jesus. Easier said than done, am I right? But it is in surrender we find life abundant. Jesus tells us in Matthew 10:39, "Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it." Throughout the song are lyrics that proclaim surrender: Come, have your way ... our hearts are open ... we wait on You ... do what you wanna do ... Let Your kingdom come, let Your will be done.

Let us praise our God with a declaration of our openness to and eagerness for Him to move in power in our lives, in our community, and in our world.

to a great park in Sheldon. It was a beautiful day to spend together!




The Giving Christian: Chapter 4 - Giving the Gift of Resources

This. The topic where everyone's minds go to when stewardship is brought up...the resources we have in the money God blesses each one of us with. But as we all know, and have read in this book, money is only a small part of being a steward, but it's still part of being a steward and we need to talk about it because it's biblical and what God talks to us about in scripture, we need to talk about as well.

When we talking about giving our resources, we have to first acknowledge that all our resources come from God alone, even life itself is from God along with our eternal life because of what God gave to us. When God calls us to give it's only by example. He doesn't ask anything of us that He hasn't done himself, like giving His only Son for us to have eternal life. He has given us the ultimate sacrifice, so the least we can do is give back...because all that we have doesn't really belong to us to begin with. God entrusted to us all we have so that we could manage it for the purposes of God. In short, Kirk Nowery states, "The Giving Christian lives by a creed of stewardship, not ownership." Granted that can give us a paradox: we give to others and then we get the blessing of giving in return, but what we give isn't ours, it's from God. Nowery talks about how accepting that paradox can liberate us from trying to accumulate wealth in every way possible and trying to have the bigger and better things like

our neighbors. That leads into areas of giving resources that we can keep in mind.

Giving faithfully - "Faithful givers are faithful stewards," states Nowery. Being a faithful giver is two-fold. We give because we have faith in God remembering He is Lord of all, and we give in a dependable manner. When and how much we give keeps Jesus' words in mind when he said, "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Maybe you've experienced the power of giving that has such a positive effect also keeping our priorities in order!

Giving gracefully – Have you ever gotten a gift from someone, and were so appreciative of it that they reminded you over and over that they were the one who gave it to you? That's not a graceful giver. "Graceful giving never draws attention to itself but directs attention to God...seeks go glorify God and not better one's own bottom line...and lifts up the recipient, not the giver," defines Nowery.

Giving proportionally – "A powerful principle of stewardship is that God's provision dictates the believer's proportion...The measure of God's giving determines the measure of our giving. As Jesus said, 'To whom much is given, much is required,'" states Nowery. Scripture talks about tithing, which is 10%. Nowery and I believe that's a great base for giving. Maybe you're not there, then little by little work towards that. If you're already at 10%, then work on increasing little by little, but we should always strive to God as much as we can.

Giving sacrificially – The best example of giving all we have is the widow referred to in scripture. She only had one mite left and was at the tabernacle to give it, even though she was getting judged by a Pharisee close by. In this chapter, Nowery refers to a pastor from Atlanta that interrupted a hymn his congregation was singing, *Take My Life and Let it Be.* A line in the hymn is "take my silver and my gold, not a mite would I withhold." Pastor Peter Marshall encouraged the congregation to only sing that line if they meant it with all sincerity. When they got to that line, the massive church that had been humming with beautiful voices became very quiet and the music even slowed down to a stop. Pastor Marshall made his point in saying that it's OK for us to stop and think because giving matters and it must be taken seriously.

Giving globally – Again, God shows us by example that He doesn't only give to his own Jewish people or only to Christians, but He gives to everyone and He showed it stated in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world..." God doesn't only give certain nations in our world, but He gives to the whole world, even the most sacrificial gift He had to give in the gift of His Son.

In previous ministries I've been part of, some have stated that their gift is just the icing on the cake. Is that because they don't want to commit to an amount, or they want to hang onto all they can? I've also heard a family struggling to make ends meet and the husband told the wife to give more to the church. The wife was dumbfounded on that, but when the end of the month came, they financially had what they needed.

If you try to hold on tight to what God gives, we will never see a miracle in how God wants to provide for all we need. And if we only try to use our resources to benefit our bottom line, we won't feel the deep sense of blessing others with what God has given us. Take a good look at your finances and budget and dig deep to give so you can see how God wants to bless you with more resources to give.

Special Youth Challenge Ministries of Northwest Iowa




