From the Pen of Pastor
Ben Giving
Thanks to
God

When the Pilgrims first saw America in November 1620, they assembled to read Psalm 100: "Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.... Enter his gates with thanksgiving." Four months later, half of the Pilgrims were dead! Our national equivalent would be 165 MILLION deceased! Or on a state level, imagine 1.5 MILLION funerals in Iowa this winter!

A year later, after the surviving Pilgrims' first harvest, they gathered to give thanks to God and to their Native American neighbors. They acknowledged God as their Provider and themselves as unentitled receivers of divine goodness. We do not have to feel like it to give thanks. We may struggle with anxiety or anger, but we can choose to give thanks.

Who do you thank for the goodness in your life? There is temptation to look away from our gracious God, even for our presidents.

President Washington clearly called for thanksgiving to God. In his first proclamation of Thanksgiving Day, he declared in 1789:

"It is the duty of all Nations to **acknowledge the providence of Almighty God,** to obey his will, to **be grateful for his benefits,** and humbly to implore his protection and favor...a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God."

President Abraham Lincoln called Americans to thank God in 1863: "The year that is drawing toward its close has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added which are of so extraordinary a nature that they can not fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to **the ever-watchful providence of Almighty God."**

Sadly, President Barack Obama, in his Thanksgiving Declarations, shifted from thanking God to thanking people. His last Thanksgiving Declaration emphasized interpersonal thanksgiving and did not name "God."

"The Pilgrims were grateful they could rely on the generosity of the Wampanoag people, without whom they would not have survived their first year in the new land, and together they celebrated this bounty with a festival that lasted for days and prompted the tradition of an annual day of giving thanks.... As we gather in the company of our friends, families, and communities—just as the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag did centuries ago—let us strive to lift up others."

President Joe Biden has begun well, naming God and even quoting the Bible in his Thanksgiving Declaration last year:

"This American spirit of gratitude...moved Abraham Lincoln to proclaim Thanksgiving a national holiday, honoring America's bounty and asking God to bring us together to care for one another and heal our Nation.... As Scripture says: 'let us rejoice always, pray continually, and give thanks in all circumstances."

As we approach Thanksgiving and the close of the year, it is the perfect time to remind ourselves that our families, health and homes are gifts from God. Expressing thanks to people around us is good. Giving thanks to Almighty God is both our duty and an incredible privilege! Every day this November, share with someone, something for which you thank God.

Never and Always

How many times have you heard "Jesus loves you?" If you've grown up in the church, the answer is likely to be quite high, and even if you spent most of your life outside of the church sphere, you probably still have heard the phrase more times than you can count.

How many times have you heard the phrase, "Jesus will never stop loving you?" Probably



not as often, or perhaps ever. These two phrases are nearly synonymous, but the first our brain has heard so many times that it has become rote, whereas the second presents the same idea in a new way. It is often this new way of thinking that helps me to recognize the truth God has for me. I may have heard something all my life, but it is only once I hear it in a new way does the truth sink into my heart.


This is why I selected Tasha Layton's song, "Never", for the worship article this month. Tasha incorporates many of God's promises for us in her lyrics, many of which you have likely heard before. For example, you have likely heard God's promise to always be with us (Matthew 28:20), or to work everything for our good (Romans 8:28), or to hold everything together (Colossians 1:17). Each of these promises are included in the song "Never", but are each rephrased to give us a different perspective on God's promises. The chorus declares that we are "Never forgotten, never forsaken, never abandoned – not for a second ... You're never not working; my heart is the proof. There's not a broken too broken for You."

When I first heard this song I was slightly taken aback - I'm so used to hearing God's promises in terms of what they *are* that hearing them in this reverse perspective made me question the truth of the lyrics. But as I considered each line, the Holy Spirit reminded me of Scripture verses backing up each promise, and I suddenly understood God's promises for me – and indeed, each of us – in a much deeper way. I know Scripture repeatedly asserts "Do not be afraid for I am with you," but hearing that I am never forsaken or abandoned caused me to realize the constancy of God's presence.

As you listen to this song, I invite you to relish the promises God provides for us. I pray that their meaning will sink deeper into your mind and soul, and you will know with absolute certainty that you are indeed never abandoned or forgotten by the One who made you, that you are wholly and completely loved, and that you are safe in God's hands, "always and forever."




Ephesians 2:10 ~ "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."



Welcome to Faith's 2nd Annual Reverse Advent Calendar! This project is organized by Faith Lutheran's Mission Team. It's a fun and caring project where anyone who wishes can take part. It is called a Reverse Advent Calendar because we are "giving" rather than "receiving".

Each day from December 1 through December 24, each person, group, or family that decides to participate will set aside a non-perishable food item, for 24 items all together. No home canned products, please, due to health and safety concerns.

You may choose to collect the food items day by day and bring them to church each week. Or, you may choose to collect all 24 items before bringing them to church – whatever works best for you. There will be a special area for the food items on the east side of the worship area by a Christmas tree.

We will give these items to Upper Des Moines Opportunity and Grand Avenue Community Outreach food pantries. If there is someone in our Faith family that could use these food items, we would be very happy to share with you as well.

Faith's Mission Partners



World Mission Prayer League by Kay Iversen The World Mission Prayer League (WMPL) is a Lutheran organization with headquarters in Minneapolis, MN. They are committed to know Christ, pray for His kingdom, and share the gospel and themselves with those who don't know Him. Their passion is to evangelize the world whereever people don't know Jesus as their savior. To do that, WMPL has 100 missionaries in 20 countries around the world. WMPL is unique in the approach to raising funds to support these missionaries. It does not ask for funds directly or conduct campaigns but rather prays for God to supply the necessary means through individual donations to send missionaries around the world.

In the mid-1930s, a band of students, pastors and friends gathered together to pray for the nations. Imagine – young people sharing their lives, their hearts, and a passion for the lost. This is exactly how the World Mission Prayer League began! That was then, but it is also now, because prayer is what WMPL is about when missionaries go out into the world.

The mission statement for WMPL declares their passion for reaching the lost. "We will share the gospel. And our sharing will involve more than our words. We propose sharing "ourselves" ... our very lives (1 Thessalonians 2:8)."

WMPL makes disciples along the frontiers. "We will apply our prayers and resources, in particular, along the frontier of the unreached – those peoples among whom an indigenous, missionizing, church-planting movement has yet to be established. We will apply ourselves further, as much as possible, along the frontier of limited access – unreached peoples among whom few global workers are serving, or traditional workers cannot go."

WMPL works toward an indigenous, missional, church-planting movement, wherever God has led them. They will work under the structures of the church as it exists in hopeful partnership, that the church may be planted where it has not yet advanced.

Leadership is developed within the communities where WMPL sends their missionaries. "We believe that God has equipped the church with everything needful for its basic ministries of proclamation, service and administration. We believe that God equips the church, as well, with the leadership necessary for its life and ministry. We will pray and work to encourage and develop its leadership in every way."

This is also what your Mission Team asks of you – to pray for WMPL and the missionaries that they send. Of course, people being sent need resources, so Faith's Missions Team also donates part of the offerings from our members to this mission partner. Anger is a natural mental and emotional human response that can come in many forms. It may be frustration of not getting our way in a particular situation, taking offense from the words and behaviors of family, friends, or neighbors, having unpredictable and/or explosive negative reactions to circumstances, or developing a grudge against someone or a situation that can result in bitterness and malice toward another.

We recognize external anger which may be a response to feeling overwhelmed, being in pain, or wanting to appear powerful and thus controlling. Being sarcastic, behaving erratically, stress eating and drinking, and self-harming behavior may be signals that anger is present. Anger may be expressed internally. It can be a physiological response, due to low blood sugar or other chemical imbalances. Anger may be present when fear, worry, frustration, pain, and depression are going on inside of us.

As Christians, we struggle with how we process anger when we know God's intention is for us to be "quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger" (James 1:19). Whatever the situation, we must remember that we are God's children and have been given authority to manage this often-destructive response, no matter who difficult it may be.

Colossians 3:8 reminds us that we must "put away wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from our mouths." Rather, we are to "turn away from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it" (Psalm 34:14). We may be tempted to say, "that's too hard to not have the last word, to not stand up for myself." God's Word tells us repeatedly that we must restrain ourselves from anger. We can do that by knowing what our triggers are and why we react the way we do.

Sometimes, seeking out a trusted family member, friend or counselor can help us sort out what these influences are that give us so much unrest. When we know our anger's source, we can release its energy in healthier ways for our benefit and for those around us. Exploring workable techniques within our trusted circle or through counseling can help us understand what we need to do to improve our well-being and our relationships.

Since anger and bitterness are such destructive strongholds, our Lord Jesus' beatitudes give us divine instruction to combat their power. He teaches the concepts of us practicing mercy and forgiveness, being pure in heart, and being peacemakers. We are told to be merciful, which reflects our understanding of God's trait of giving grace. When we forgive or someone forgives us, this provides healing. As we strive to be obedient to God's Word, we learn we can come closer to Him in our thoughts, words and deeds and know the peace He gives.

When we live with these character qualities, we are known for our kindness, our integrity, and our ability to stay at peace even when it is difficult to do so. We can aspire to the goal of Colossians 3:13: "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord has forgiven you." May we manage our anger by sharing these blessings as opportunities arise in our lives.


The New Time & Talent Sheets
