From the Pen of Pastor Ben -Giving Thanks to

Christmas 1s Coming to You!

My dad, my pastor, was always in church on Sunday morning! Always! He was in church with me, or he was preaching in another church.

Except one time! Mom was gone too. Though I was only three years old, I still remember the date – April 24.

After church that morning, Gene and Francis Reuther took the five Unseth boys home for Sunday dinner. I don't actually remember the church service that morning or dinner. What I do remember is the phone call from Dad: We had a new baby brother! Five big brothers shouted for joy that our boys' dorm would not be polluted with femininity. The baby's name was Joseph. Today he may tell you that he was raised by wolves.

What did I have to do with Joseph's birth? Nothing.

What did I do to help bring him home? Nothing.

What did I do to help feed him? Nothing.

Yet Joseph changed my life.

He didn't waste thousands of hours trying to become a professional athlete as I did. He was busy solving problems. When I couldn't fix my bicycle, Joe figured it out and fixed it. When my cars break down, I call Joe.

When my mother has needed help building or fixing something, she has never called me. She has waited for Joe to come.

When my son Spencer died, Joe drove his casket 750 miles to the cemetery.

My brother Joe reminds me that I often look at Christmas backwards. I had nothing to do with Joe's coming, and I certainly had nothing to do with Jesus' coming.

I tend to think about what **I'm doing** for Christmas, but Christmas is all about Jesus coming to us – **what God does** through sending His one and only Son Jesus into the world. "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through Him" (John 3:17).

Every week this December, I will remind seekers and saints at Faith Lutheran Church that Christmas is coming to you! We can celebrate. We will experience peace and joy in Jesus ... our Savior born in Bethlehem.

All is Well - Alleluia

Have you ever looked around at the world and thought, "Where is a good God in the midst of such evil"? I certainly have, and I expect most of you have thought that at one point or another. The world we live in is far from perfect and sometimes feels darker than the light. So how can Michael W. Smith so definitively declare, as he titled his song, "All is Well"? Perhaps it would be more appropriate to say that all *will* be well – when Christ returns the second time to imprison Satan and do away with all trace of evil. And while Advent is all about looking forward to Christ's return, we still live, here and now, in this world tarnished by sin.

Yet Michael W. Smith doesn't say all *will* be well; he says all *is* well – and he even bolsters this proclamation multiple times throughout the song with the lyrics "sing alleluia". The word 'alleluia' (sometimes spelled hallelujah, which means the same thing) is a combination of two Hebrew words: *hallel*, meaning 'praise' and *yah*, meaning 'God'. Thus, alleluia = praise God.

Praise God – why? That's just it. There is no stipulation. We aren't praising God because of His goodness, or lovingkindness, or mercy, though those are certainly reasons to praise God. But here, in alleluia, we are simply praising God. No 'because'. No reason why. Just – God. God, who has carried us in our past. God, who is forming and molding us now. God, who will come back one day. Just – God.

There may still be corruption in this world (for now), but God is still God, and thus all is well. Alleluia – Praise God.

Proverbs 4:7 (NIV) "The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom. Though it cost you all you have, get understanding."



Welcome to Faith's 2nd Annual Reverse Advent Calendar! This project is organized by Faith Lutheran's Mission Team. It's a fun and caring project where anyone who wishes can take part. It is called a Reverse Advent Calendar because we are "giving" rather than "receiving".

Each day from December 1 through December 24, each person, group, or family that decides to participate will set aside a non-perishable food item, for 24 items all together. No home canned products, please, due to health and safety concerns.

You may choose to collect the food items day by day and bring them to church each week. Or, you may choose to collect all 24 items before bringing them to church – whatever works best for you. There will be a special area for the food items on the east side of the worship area by a Christmas tree.

We will give these items to Upper Des Moines Opportunity and Grand Avenue Community Outreach food pantries. If there is someone in our Faith family that could use these food items, we would be very happy to share with you as well.

During October, Pastor Ben based his messages on the book of Ruth. In chapter 2, we learned how Boaz was a "kinsman redeemer" and he provided grain for Ruth and Naomi who needed food. Let's be "friend redeemers" as we provide food for those around us.



The Christian and Missionary Alliance, otherwise known as the C&MA or The Alliance, is an evangelical denomination full of believers who long to introduce the love of God to all nations. The Christian and Missionary Alliance is currently one of our Mission Team partners. The Alliance was formed in 1881 when Pastor A. B. Simpson organized a small group of believers devoted to witnessing to the marginalized people of New York City. As the organization grew, so did their purpose, eventually expanding to more than 2,000 U.S. churches and 70 countries. The Alliance aims to carry out their vision of "All of Jesus for All the World". By following God's call and partnering with more than 700 international workers, C&MA desires to bring God's hope to the nations by caring for suffering and overlooked people, so that Jesus' name will be proclaimed in every tribe and tongue to fulfill the Great Commission.

Two of C&MA's international workers are Louis and Jane Faulstich, a couple from Ruthven, Iowa. They are now working in the country of Vanuatu, an island in the South Pacific near Papua New Guinea, as missionaries and Bible translators. Louis and Jane are working to fulfill the Great Commission where God has led them in Vanuatu, just as we follow God's leading here in Iowa. Louis and Jane Faulstich and the Christan and Missionary Alliance are currently one of our Mission Partners at Faith, as we support them financially and in prayer. Please continue to keep the Faulstich's in your prayers as they go and make disciples of all nations, working to bring all of Jesus to all the world.

We can practice being JOYful, even when we may not feel it, and show it to others in big and small ways. Saint Paul, in Philippians 4:6-7, tells us to "be filled with joy. Let everyone see that you are gentle and kind."

Our hearts and minds contain great power to change the perspective of our immediate circle. Collectively, we can do so much more to bring people to Jesus. We can pray for others to experience this JOY, too. We can exert our spirit-filled muscle to spread the glad tidings of great JOY to all people we come in contact with. During this holiday season, we have the chance to show those around us through service what God's goodness, His peace, and JOY look like when we do His will.

Tech project – Jacob handed out a proposal from RDI out of Milford to upgrade our projector system. He went over the details of the equipment included in the proposal. It does include some training for our tech team. Our current system is original to the church. It is starting to have a few issues due to its age. As it ages, it will get harder to maintain & get parts.

Insurance overview – The building is under-valued and we don't have a commercial umbrella policy. Cyber insurance was also suggested that we have but that would involve changing some things on the computers. Our insurance policy renews in December. Our premium would go up almost \$3,500 based on current value and a commercial umbrella for \$2 million will increase our premium by \$1,000. It was discussed to have our agent come out and look at the property and discuss with Becky, Eli and anyone else that would like to be a part of this discussion.

Advent meals – It was decided to just do pot luck. Joe to talk to Larry to have a couple people line some things up prior to each Advent service.

Team budgets - Try to have your team budgets & year end reports together by **December 10**.

LifeKids update – Bill said their current budget will get them through to the end of this year. Cleaning was an issue so they hired their own janitor.
