However, I look back at the things that did happen this summer and my heart swells with emotion. So much has changed for so many. - 3. Many committees have formed to participate in the rebuilding of Faith Lutheran. They have been so generous with their time and commitment to doing the best they can for our church.
- 4. Our Sunday school is starting in September!!! Children will be learning about God in our building! We even celebrated 3 baptisms all while under construction!
- 5. So many people have stepped up and continue to volunteer time, food, prayer, hospitality and money. We are so thankful for the gifts that everyone has shared.
- 6. Our executive team, church council and project committees have been dedicated to our work as leaders of the church. It is not an easy job and I am thankful to work with some of the most dedicated, faithful servants!
- 7. Since the flood, we have not missed one week of worship! We thank our staff, technology team and pastor for being faithful, flexible, problemsolvers!

- 8. We have an insulated building and will be ready for the cool weather ahead. Our duct work and heating/cooling units will soon be cleaned, insulated and repaired, ready for the season ahead.
- We have many bids coming in for carpet, front door, drywall, kitchen cabinets etc...and we will prioritize those as our budget allows.
- 10. Most importantly we continue to trust that God is with us in every step we take. He will not let us walk this path alone or in the dark. I am so grateful that His love for us never ends.

Building Report

August flew by very quickly. A couple projects which have been completed this past month is the skirting around the outside perimeter cut off and replaced, done with many volunteers. What a great group to get to work with, we had a long day but finished it up on a Saturday. Ymker Insulation was then brought in and the spray foam was applied. Now our entire outside perimeter is spray foamed which seals, insulates and helps prevent rodents from moving in. We are trying to get rebates through a couple different companies to help with costs. Sunday school rooms carpet adhesive was all removed and the floors sealed so when we are ready to put the new carpet down it will be ready to do. Estimates have been acquired on repairing the Hvac systems along with cleaning the duct work and insulating the outside of the ducts.





Currently it is insulated on the inside but this all needs to be removed. Outside insulation will be more efficient and won't cost much more. The north exterior sliding door is being replaced with double manual doors along with all the glass. Going with manual doors on the north side will improve our comfort especially in the winter as the doors will not be open so long and also maintenance will be mostly eliminated. The south sliding door will stay in tach, so we continue to have an inviting entrance and also handicap accessibility. Appliances for the kitchen have been purchased and estimates are being put together for the cupboards in the kitchen. Carpet color and pattern along with chairs have been picked out and are ready to order when we are ready. We have had many individuals working on all these projects, many hours away from family, jobs and weekend fun have been given up to rebuild our Faith church. We have fun working together and have yummy lunches. I would like to invite all to come join us, there are many different areas we are able to work in and room for all! Thanks to all our volunteers, I cant help but think God is proud of you all!

God Is With Us

As we have continued flood cleanup and restoration, it has occurred to me that someone going through this can take one of two outlooks: they can look everything around them touched by flood waters, or they can look at everyone around them helping clean up. It is certainly true that we have lost much, and others have lost even more. It is easy, and perhaps even natural, to look at the church with the eyes of what is missing. The bottom half of all the walls. Sanctuary chairs. A proper altar. Even the worship platform itself is only a skeleton, the mini grand in storage, and the printers currently unable to print bulletins for us each Sunday.



But if you take a moment to adjust your thoughts, you can look around at this same building and realize who has been here throughout the process. A dozen people (including a couple of friendly kayakers) helped to save what they could as the flood waters swiftly rose around them. Countless people volunteered their time, talents, and even skid loaders to start the demolition process. Strong teen boys helped break desks, pop locks open, and scrape carpet squares off the floor. Skilled men and women helped to powerwash items and redo the outside tin, and will help with rebuilding and insulating walls, reconstructing the stage, and countless other projects.

Many people have been involved throughout the process, and a few can even say they have been here most of the work days thus far. But only One has been here each step of the way: as this church was founded, as the flood waters rose, as the world waited for waters to recede. As neighbors, friends, and strangers joined hands to toss flood soaked items and tear apart walls. As donations started to come in toward the Flood Relief Fund, and as faithful volunteers stepped up to lead us through the rebuilding process. You may have guessed this One is God, and you would be right. God has been here since before the church existed, was here as the water rose and fell, and is here now as we figure life out again. God has not left, and will never leave us. When you look at the devastation you may ask "where is God in all this?". But if you look closer, you'll see God is with us. To quote The Afters in their song aptly named 'God is With Us', God is 'right here where He's always been. He never left and He never will. Where is God? God is with us."

In the time of Moses, God dwelled in the tabernacle and the Ark of the Covenant. If the Ark of the Covenant went missing, God went with it. August 14, 2024 Council Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by President Pam Hanson at 7:04 PM.

Members present were: Emily Hoppe, Kris Behrens, Dave Susie, Justin Spieker, Pam Hanson, Pastor Ben, Gloria McKinney, Nancy Ketcham, Barb Solberg, Ross & Beth Brockshus, Pete Crew, Jared Hansen & Jolene Hansen.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Pam Hanson. Devotions were given by Nancy Ketcham.

Prior months minutes were reviewed. Motion to approve made by Pete Crew. Jared Hansen seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Prior months financial statement – Undesignated giving was around \$30,000 (inc the sale of the bus). Expenses were around \$27,000. YTD is almost \$205,000 and last year was approximately \$207,000. YTD expenses are decreasing so catching up on the shortage. Pete Crew motioned to approve. Beth Brockshus seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. Flood relief funds received in July were around \$72,000. This gives us approximately \$115,000 available for flood repairs.

TREASURER'S REPORT – As of the end of July we have received \$114,406 and \$3,000 in Thrivent cards towards flood relief.

PASTOR BEN'S REPORT – Pastor has been working on getting the church back in order with what he can do. Crosswinds is having the ILCC soccer students involved in their church, so Pastor is focusing his energy into working with young adults in our congregation. Having just purchased a home, he will lead a weekly Bible study there along with a meal together, and occasionally community service work. Jacob Weeks & Nathan McKenney will be living there to start with. The Pastor from Hope Church has a list of names of people that have reached out and need some assistance (Stephen's Ministry?). Let Pastor know if you would like to follow up with someone from this list.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Pam Hanson) -

TECHNOLOGY REPORT (Lance Storley) – RDI checked out the system and not much was damaged. A subwoofer was on the floor but otherwise, in pretty good shape. Lance is going to add/move some outlets on the platform per RDI recommendation.

- · Youth Ministry (Matt & Steph Essick) Will start this up after Clay County Fair. More to come. Confirmation orientation will be August 28. Trinity will be sharing confirmation classes with us.

- · Caring Ministries (Ross & Beth Brockshus) The group is meeting with potluck the end of this month.
- · Fellowship (Lee & Nancy Ketcham) Fellowship is going great. Nancy is helping when she is available. Nancy is having people ask about providing meals for the work days. Will get a sign up sheet for people interested in doing this. Greeters are wondering where to write the attendance down so Gloria will make a sheet up and put on the front table. Pastor will mention at the Sunday services to sign up for donuts/bars/cookies on Sunday morning. Will also mention food sign up for the work days.
- · Music & Creative Arts (Jared Hansen) Nothing to report.
- · Properties () -

OLD BUSINESS

- · Bus was re-sold and \$4,000 was made and donated to Faith's General fund it has been removed from our insurance and off of our property prior to the flood.
- · Technology fundraising on-going we are not touching these funds.
- · July 28th Congregational meeting spending cap of \$175,000 was approved. Anything over that will require another Congregational meeting.
- · Paul Behrens, project manager for Flood Repair Paul is forming a committee to help him make decisions on the various things that need to happen.
- · Properties position & technology help still looking for someone. The nominating committee will need to start looking for replacements for Eric (Evangelism), Kirby (Children's Ministry) & Pete (Worship). They will also need to look for a Vice President.

NEW BUSINESS

· Goals, priorities & steps to repair building; bids for work; Grants/funds/insurance – the tin is finished on the outside of the building. Starting in the middle of next week, they will begin spray foaming. Items will need to be moved out of the rooms to get to the outside walls (storage & discipleship rooms). We have gotten a sample chair in to look at and they were very happy with those. We don't want to order them until the drywall is done. The carpet has been picked out. They are doing carpet squares for the Sunday school rooms & offices. The platform & aisle runner will be done with carpet (no pad). They are going to get a bid to have someone grind the concrete and polish it. The toilets are here but can't put them in until the drywall is done. The AC unit needs some insulation work done. Estimating this to be around \$12,000 and this doesn't include the cleaning of the duct work. Wondering if this is something we can do ourselves?? We got a quote from the door company to replace the north & south entrance doors. They quoted around \$600 to replace the glass but we feel like there would still be some mold in there. New doors would run approximately \$10-12,000 each. We are getting quotes for different style doors as well. The door company has said that the current style doors are not efficient. Looking at doors that have the handicap button to open the doors and were quoted \$13,000 per door. We also have to be concerned about following codes (ADA) & making sure the open wide enough. We would like to get these installed before winter. Denison Drywall bid is signed & it will run us around \$38,000. We will be doing wainscotting behind the altar area (north end) and we will do that ourselves. Kitchen appliances have been purchased. The Thrivent cards paid for most of that and we purchased them at Menards to get the 11% rebate. We are continuing to get several Thrivent cards. They spray foam will run about \$8,600. The copy machine works for copies but having some issues with the printing. Dave & Linda Susie have been working on this.

NEW BUSINESS (continued)

- · Life Kids 5013c- They have decided to put LifeKids on hold for a year. They have had their 5013c revoked so they are no longer tax exempt. During COVID, the IRS wasn't sending the reminders out regarding the documentation that were required. They are trying to get it reinstated, there is a substantial fine to pay but could potentially get the fine waived. Cheryl is technically an employee of Faith Lutheran & we do their payroll. Cheryl is a "for profit" employee & this could impact our applying for grants, FEMA, etc. Cheryl has accepted a teaching job at Spencer Schools for 1 year. Once we get more information from LifeKids, we may have to take some action on this.
- · Work days Gloria sends those out via email, text and will add Facebook.
- · 2025 budget We are starting to work on this. We aren't sure what the insurance will look like for 2025. We are looking at possibly changing the deductible which is currently at \$5,000. The Exec Team are working on getting several quotes to keep it in check with our giving.

Concerns and/or Celebrations

Andrea, Abbey & Lori are in Madagascar on a Mission trip. There aren't any roads and they do a lot of riding. They will be back around the 21st.

Spencer Family Church has decided to disband.

Becky is having surgery on the 20th on her back/neck.

Beau Hoppe is having gallbladder surgery on Friday.

Closing Prayer was given by Justin Spieker.

Adjournment – Pete made the motion to adjourn. Jared seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:00 PM.
