### Holy Spirit, Holy Jesus, and You

I'm nervous about preaching this December. I can talk nonstop about "Jesus" and the "Bible." Some of my friends can carry on for hours about the "Holy Spirit."

Me? By temperament, I'm a "just the facts" person. God has grown my soul in faith. He has stretched me far in trusting him. Yet, when we explore the Holy Spirit, I often feel like I'm on ground that is moving under me. I am cautious. I don't ride a skateboard; it calls for a fluid coordination that eludes me. I fall down hard. Just solid facts for me.

Exploring the Holy Spirit feels kind of like riding a skateboard. Holy Spirit is difficult to pin down, to crisply categorize. However, we are stepping into

the Gospel of Luke together. We will focus on Luke every Sunday from now through Easter. Luke loves talking about the Holy Spirit. Luke names the Holy Spirit more in Luke 1-2 than Matthew, Mark, or John do in their whole Gospels! Luke names the Holy Spirit as many times in his one Gospel as Paul does in all of his letters to churches.

How much does Luke like talking about the Holy Spirit? Luke wrote two books of the Bible for us—Luke and Acts. In those two books, he names the Holy Spirit more than all the other books of the Bible do combined.

That leaves me feeling a little unsettled...until I remember a few Scriptures about the Holy Spirit:

- How does the Bible start? "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." (Genesis 1:1-2).
- How does the Bible end? "The Spirit and the bride say, 'Come!' And let the one who hears say, 'Come!' Let the one who is thirsty come; and let the one who wishes take the free gift of the water of life." (Revelation 22:17).
- How does Jesus comfort his disciples at the Last Supper? "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:26-27).

We do not need to be experts on the Holy Spirit. He was at Creation and will be at the Second Coming, and he is with us today. As Christians, Holy Spirit is already active in our lives. In December, we are celebrating the coming of the Savior and all that he wants to do in our lives through his Holy Spirit.

## He Shall Reign Forevermore

Fun fact: The folks of Talkeetna, Alaska have had a cat for their mayor since 1997. Mayor Stubbs held office at Nagly's General Store from 1997 to 2017. Upon his passing, the town elected Stubb's successor, another cat named Denali. (Granted, the town is unincorporated, and therefore the office of Mayor is only honorary, but still.) Wouldn't life be great if every town had a cat for their mayor?!?

You're probably thinking that I might be crazy (and you might be right). After all, cats don't have much sense of logic or understanding of the world, or even opposable thumbs. It would be silly to hand control of our community over to a cat, even a very cute cat!



But isn't it also absurd to think about handing control over to a little baby? In monarchies where birth determines the next rulers, there have been instances where young children have been appointed as king or queen before they are able to walk. Unto us a child is born, the King of kings and Lord of lords. And he shall reign forevermore, forevermore."

## 2024 Mission Team Update

Faith Lutheran Church generously supports the sharing of the Good News in many ways both here and abroad. Through the faithful contributions of our congregation, the Faith Mission Team comprised of Kris Behrens, Chair, Donna Johnson, Alice Nielsen, Brittany Spieker, Julie Williams, and Kim Wilson, oversees the distribution of these funds. Pastor Unseth serves as an informed liaison to other relevant church and community interests that may impact Mission work here at our church.

The Mission Team meets bimonthly at the church to address mission needs and determine partners receiving financial and other assistance with their missions. In 2024, fourteen Mission Partners, who represent local, state, regional, national, and international missions received twelve percent (12%) of the general giving Faith Lutheran determines available for mission activities. Lenten and Advent offering proceeds are also designated to special mission projects.


In 2024, recipients of ongoing assistance included ATLAS, Falls Church, Friends of Madagascar, International Messengers (the Smiths) LCMC National and Iowa District, Lutheran Asian Ministries, the Multi-Church Community Assistance Fund, Ingham Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp, World Mission Prayer League, Upper Des Moines Opportunity Food Pantry, and YWAM (Marlee Nicholson).

Grand Avenue Community Outreach and the Community Kitchen co-located there, also received first-quarter assistance but have since discontinued operations due to debilitating flood damage. Likewise, LifeKIds was also an initial recipient but with suspended activity due to the flooding of the church, the Mission Team is evaluating with their Board their needs for future church mission funding.

Each year, during late October and November, the Mission Team accepts applications from potential Mission Partners, who are asked to share information about their organization or personal request, their mission's focus, their greatest need, how Faith Lutheran funds can help, other funding sources available to help with this need, and any other pertinent information. Complete applications are reviewed at the December Mission Team meeting to determine funding recipients, based on need and projected funding availability. We invite Faith Lutheran members to contact the Mission Team for more information and an application if you know of a mission opportunity you would like the Team to consider.

Throughout the year, the Mission Team requires updates on the investment Faith Lutheran Church has made from funded Mission Partners. Progress and concerns from each Mission Partner are shared throughout the year through in-person contact, videos, letters, and other forms of correspondence to keep the Team and the congregation informed. This information is featured on the Mission Team's Bulletin Board, newsletter features, during worship, speaker presentations, and displays, to tell the congregation about their funding at work.

Despite the financial impact due to our recent flooding, Faith Lutheran Church members continue a steady stream of financial and prayerful support of our church's activities, including our commitment to Missions. We praise God for His blessings and thank you, as His messengers, for your support of these vital opportunities to share the Gospel and His love with the world through these called and faithful servants.

#### Faith Lutheran Church Council meeting minutes - November 13, 2024

The meeting was called to order by VP Justin Spieker at 7:02 PM and opened in prayer.

Members present were: Nancy Ketchum, Pam Hanson, Pastor Ben, Kirby Fueston, Dave Susie, Justin Spieker, Lance Storley, Gloria McKenney, Barb Solberg, Kris Behrens, Eric Tigges, Ross & Beth Brockshus, & Emily Hoppe. Devotions were given by Kirby Fueston.

Prior months minutes were reviewed. Motion to approve made by Eric Tigges. Beth Brockshus seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Prior months financial statement – For the month of October we were in the black. We are still behind on our budget but we are spending less than budgeted. Admin costs have decreased due staff having surgery & just being more efficient. Motion made by Emily to approve. Kris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT** – Flood Money - \$133,672.36 in the account currently. We have committed to drywall \$50,000, carpet \$26,000, cabinets \$42,000.

**PASTOR BEN'S REPORT** – Pastor shared some highlights: Pastor has a wedding at Zion. We have four people applying for membership this fall. Jacob Weeks, Connie Conlon, Nancy Taylor & Kaleigh Pearson will be joining our church this month.

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT** (Pam Hanson) – See the attached report. Discussion regarding chairs for the sanctuary as we are running short on Sundays. Nancy Ketchum has some that she can bring from her home or we may reach out to Clay County Fair to see if we can borrow some.

**TECHNOLOGY REPORT** – The projector is ordered. Carey's is working on some parts for one of the floor boxes on the platform. Lance is going to work on getting some youth in the Tech Booth.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- Goals/Priorities/Upcoming Steps to repair building; Bids for work; Grants; Funds; Insurance we met with FEMA regarding applying for funding but we would need to be flood insured for the length of the life of this building. Insurance would be around \$16,000/year & this would increase over the years. We are not pursuing getting any funding from them due to this. We should be reporting volunteer hours to the City so we can help the community by not having to pay back as much to FEMA for the funds the City will be getting. Becky has been working on getting a better rate on our insurance. More to come on that.
- Sending out quarterly statements through Simple Church vs Mail haven't heard any negative feedback on this.
- Communion Railing, idea was discussed but not enough interest to proceed we have dismissed this idea at this time.

#### Faith Lutheran Church Council meeting minutes - November 13, 2024 (cont'd)

- Mission Giving 12% in Constitution was removed by mistake. Adding to Congregational Meeting January 26 to put back in In order to get this back into place, Barb made a motion to do a Continuing Resolution of 12%. Kris seconded the motion. Pastor noted this will require a 2/3 majority vote by the Congregation when presented to them. Motion carried. Kirby made a motion to bring the Amendment to reinstate using 12% of the General Funds to Missions to the Congregation. Emily seconded this motion. Motion carried. This must be presented to the Congregation 30 days prior to the Congregational meeting (Annual meeting).
- Copier buy-out \$13,986.00 this was decreased to \$10,892.90.
- Replacing projector vote PASSED!

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Thanks-For-Giving Sunday; November 24 Emily is working on the workers for this...maybe the highschool youth??
- Advent/PotLuck dates: Dec 4, 11th & 18th potluck served out of the kitchen prior to the service around 5:30. Nancy will get people together to do set up, serve & clean up for those dates. Justin & Pam volunteered to help also.
- Budget work Council was given a draft to review. Total of the draft is at \$356,866.00. We are hoping to have a final draft for Council at the December meeting. If any Council members have questions on this draft, they should reach out to Justin, Pam and Carolyn.
- Pastor Ben Housing Allowance This had been \$11,000 in prior years to cover his apartment. But since he bought a house, he'd like to revise it to \$26,000 for 2024 & \$46,000 for 2025. Eric Patten is also eligible for this and will get us a number next month. This does NOT change what we pay Pastor, just changes it for tax purposes. Eric made the motion to make these changes. Kirby seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- LCMC District meeting 11/16 @ Faith; church clean up prior work night will be Thursday night (11/14) around 5:30.

#### **Concerns and/or Celebrations**

Justin wanted to give a SHOUT OUT to Pam & Dave for all of their efforts and work to get through this year. Pam was also appreciative of everyone that has done so much for our Church and our community.

Jared Hansen & Barb Solberg have given their resignations as the leads for the Creative Arts & Discipleship committees. We thank them for their time and talents in these positions & will be looking for their replacements. Adjournment – Kirby made the motion to adjourn. Nancy seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:43 PM. Closing Prayer was given by Pastor Ben.
